Welcome to Today's Service

Maltunthi - Bring us close together, Lord!

Today is Trinity Sunday, the day we celebrate and recognise the one-ness and the three-ness of God, Jesus and Spirit. It becomes a transitional day between the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (which we celebrated with Encounter last Sunday) and the season of "ordinary" time that follows. Trinity invites us to explore the various ways we experience God's activity among us as Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer into the remainder of the church year.

Trinity is difficult to define, yet something we can experience, particularly in our distinctiveness, our diversity and relationships with one another. This is particularly poignant and significant at what is the end of Reconciliation Week here in Australia. From the one-ness of the Trinity despite their distinctiveness we have a beautiful model of working together for the good of all humanity and the good of all creation, despite what we might see as our differences.
